Remedial courses are organized wherever required to cover up the deficiencies of the weaker students.

Assessment of faculty performance by students is being implemented in all Programmes and feedback is taken formally.

All the courses have been specified and approved by the State Govt. and regulatory bodies including UGC,

Most of the teaching and non-teaching posts are sanctioned and funded by the State Govt.
